### COURSE OBJECTIVES:

- Describe techniques for assessing nutritional status and nutrient needs in patients with acute renal failure (ARF) and chronic kidney disease (CKD).
- Discuss dietary approaches in CKD on controlled protein intake in the pre-dialysis phases, as well as the different nutritional supplementation modalities (oral supplementation, intradialytic parenteral nutrition) for patients on chronic hemodialysis and peritoneal dialysis.
- Present practical management of enteral and parenteral nutrition in ARF.

### INSTRUCTORS:

**Alice Sabatino** is a renal dietitian at the Nephrology unit of the Parma University Hospital. She trained as a Nutritionist in Brazil at the University of São Paulo and as a renal dietitian in Italy at the University of Pisa. She obtained a Master of Science in Human Nutrition from the University of Milan. Alice is a clinical investigator, with a research focus on renal nutrition and nutritional status evaluation and monitoring in renal patients, particularly, critically ill patients with AKI, ESRD patients on hemodialysis and kidney transplant patients. She is the recipient of the 2015 Young Investigator research grant by the Italian Society of Parenteral and Enteral Nutrition (SINPE) and has published 18 papers in the field of renal nutrition and metabolism in peer-reviewed scientific journals.

**Johane Allard, MD, FRDPC**, Professor of Medicine at the University of Toronto, will be supporting delivery of this LLL session.
